Australian Government with the UN in Cyprus and should return to Canberra in the second half of 2009 to resume his work with the AFP and assume his appointment with the ABA. Phil brings to the position a wealth of local knowledge about Canberra and the ACT region and its people. As a career police officer with the AFP, Phil has worked not only in the ACT, but also overseas on many occasions with the International Deployment Force. Vic has sent the following report regarding his recent experience with the TV crew for the program "You saved my life".



The first interview involved clearing out most of the furniture from the lounge room so the film crew could set up booms, microphones, lights and cameras.

Quite a process! The interview recording was halted when aircraft flew over and no phones calls or noise was allowed in any part of the house. The interview itself was quite a traumatic experience as old memories, events and emotions that had been successfully buried for many years were dug up. I won't go into those personal and family feeling here but suffice to say, some still hurt. The interviewer, Damien Comerford, flew into Perth from Sydney for the day and was most patient and understanding. Even the sound effects man admitted afterwards to hanging on to every word of the interview.

A few days later, Tara Brown from Channel 9 flew in from Sydney and the director flew in from New Zealand for the day for the interview. After 5 hours in 34° heat with no shade and no hats allowed I was interviewed to retell the whole incident at the original scene. Towards the end, we were all tired but things lifted when a surprise was sprung. I won't tell you any more. I can say that as a result of the previous interview, this one was a little more difficult because of the dredging up of things previously forgotten.

It may help others to understand their own feelings a little more, in the knowledge that as a group, we do understand each other and have an empathy that most people can never feel.

Geoff Boyce Award for the Young & Brave. Our first winner of the GBA is James Foley BM. Pictured on the Right. His citation reads - In the early hours of 17 October 2006, Mr Foley rescued family members from their burning house at Vinifera, Victoria. Mr Foley (18 at the time) was awoken by his father yelling that the family home was on fire. The house was filled with smoke, and in the darkness, Mr Foley woke his younger sister. He immediately smashed a window and helped push her through the opening to the side of the building. Concerned for the safety of his two younger brothers, Mr Foley ran to the rear of the house to check their whereabouts. He pulled doors off their hinges and crawled through the building which was now being engulfed by fire. Mr Foley

continued to check for his brothers, yelling out their names. Fearing for their lives, he crawled further into the house where he discovered both boys, and was able to assist them out of the building and to safety with the rest of the family. Mr Foley ran for help to a next door neighbour and then moved the family car from the scene of the fire, getting his brothers and sister into the vehicle to ensure their safety. By his actions. Mr Foley displayed considerable brayery. It was a privilege to meet James and his lovely family. A special presentation was made to James by the Governor General's representative at the memorial service at Yarralumla. The Governor General HE Ms Quentin Bryce was unable to personally attend as the service co-incided with her tour of support to the affected areas of the terrible bush fires in Victoria. Tragically James' father, Steve did not survive the fire and was awarded a BM posthumously which his wife Pippa accepted on behalf of his family. James said it was his Dad that got him out of the fire and told him what to do to save his brothers. What a fine job he did. Our support and love goes to all the Foleys and family friend "Tiger" (above left). We welcome them to our ABA family. We also extend our thanks to Geoffrey Boyce, without whose generous donation this wonderful award would not be possible. The benefits for recognising "The Young and Brave" are numerous & include encouraging younger bravery award recipients into the ABA activities; Greatly assists in raising the public profile of the ABA; Offers greater opportunity for media interest in the ABA. She returned to teaching in NSW from 1991 until 1994. A career change resulted in her working as a School Psychologist in NSW from 1995 until 2005 with children from Kinder to Year 12 and their families.

In 2000 Pamela established a part time private practice specialising in consulting to private industries and government departments. The work undertaken was varied, being based in a major regional area of NSW and included mediation, court reports, child protection and both clinical and victims of crime counselling. Pamela has a particular interest in the field of Post-traumatic Stress Disorder.

Pamela established a private practice in Brisbane in 2005 and is honoured to be asked to fill the role of Honorary Psychologist to the Australian Bravery Association. She passionately believes in the work of the association and particularly in the need to find appropriate support for those recipients and their families that experience psychological difficulties as a result of their act of bravery.

**ANZAC DAY** – Many of us would have attended a service somewhere – Keith Payne VC OAM & Ken Shewan CBC had a day with a little difference.

A few days ago, Florence and Keith Payne made a flying visit to Bundaberg for a function. Over breakfast Keith told us how he was surreptitiously taken half way round the world and spent his day with the Australian Troops in Afghanistan which was no mean feat. A flight to Dubai, then a C130 Hercules, then a Chinook and lastly a Bushmaster took him to the outpost. Fantastic, Keith! I'm sure our troops were very appreciative of your visit. So for all of those looking for him on the 25<sup>th</sup> – that's where he was!

Ken represented the ABA in Kimbe, PNG and sent in the following report. Thanks Ken.

"Amongst other floral tributes laid by local dignitaries and ex service members a wreath was laid on behalf of the ABA at a dusk service on Anzac Day 2009 at the war memorial in Kimbe, West New Britain Province of Papua New Guinea. Ken Shewan ABA member from Port Melbourne, who happened to be working in the area, laid the tribute on the base of the memorial which commemorates the airmen who lost their lives in the area during WWII.

West New Britain was invaded by the Japanese in January 1942 and retaken by US and Australian troops later in the war. Kimbe is surrounded by several airstrips with Hoskins Field the current civilian airport. Medium bomber Hudsons and Spitfires were based there and seaplane Catalinas were based in the port area. The memorial lists 27 airmen who lost their lives.

The ceremony was organized by members of the San Remo Golf Club which is situated on a picturesque bay along from the main shipping wharf. A catafalque party was provided by the local police station. The anthems of PNG, Australia and New Zealand were sung by the children from the Kimbe International School. Representing the Australian High Commissioner in Port Moresby at the ceremony was Major Jeremy Webb, military attaché who also gave the address.

Another speaker was Mrs. Cecilie Benjamin of Walindi Diving Centre who gave an update on the fate of Hudson bomber A16-126 which disappeared whilst on a mission in 1942 and the wreckage of which was only discovered in 2008. Of the five crew on board who died, some of the next of kin were pleased to have received news of their relative after 66 years but others would have been quite happy to let matters rest. After the ceremony, participants enjoyed refreshments on the open verandah. A bottle of "bundy" donated by the major didn't last too long."

#### COMMUNIQUE FROM ABROAD Foundation for Civilian Bravery, Sri Lanka

Philip Chandraratne contacted John Robinson some months ago and has sent in the following news.

The Foundation for Civilian Bravery was formed by me as a trust in 1993 to recognize civilians who voluntarily risk their lives to save the lives of others. Recently established by an act of Parliament, the Foundation was organized with benefit of moral support from the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission (USA), the Royal Humane Society of the U.K., and the Royal Humane Society of Australasia. These organizations contributed excellent cooperation and guidance from a range of experience spanning more than 100 years.

The Foundation has just embarked on an international award by presenting the **Gold Medal for Civilian Bravery for Asia**. Although we have the support of The Readers Digest, it is an enormous task and responsibility to be undertaken by an organization like ours as we run our office with minimum facilities. We are convinced, however, that the world will recognize the value of our work one day and extend support. The inaugural Asian Medal was presented to a citizen of Pakistan in 2004 and then to citizens of Maldives and India.

In 2008, the Foundation commenced the **Gold Star for the Brave Student**, to recognize students who act with courage. We hope the award will foster good citizenship for our young people, as we want them to become models for society.

The awardees of the Foundation during the past 15 years are scheduled to meet on 23rd this month to form the *Association of Civilian Heroes*. This is the first occasion of such meeting in Sri Lanka.

Finally, the Foundation dreams of a **World Gold Medal**, for which the support of the reader is invited—the task is a tall order.
